In this age of global communication, international design teams, and ease of foreign travel, an experience abroad is a smart way to build your résumé, open your mind, and learn about yourself and other cultures first-hand.

Pratt Institute offers a rich variety of programs in which students can study in foreign countries. There are two kinds of opportunities: exchange programs and study abroad programs. Exchange programs are a one-to-one exchange of Pratt students with students from partner schools abroad. This is more of an immersion experience and applications are very competitive. Study abroad programs are programs in which a group of students go abroad and study together as a group. These programs are either led by Pratt faculty or taught by local instructors. Early applications are encouraged.

There is an International Education Fair in November at which exchange program and study abroad information will be available.

## EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

This type of program is perfect for the independent and self-motivated undergraduate student. It is an immersion experience in which the student is often required to speak the local language and may be the only student from Pratt at the partner school.

This is a junior-year exchange program. Students take from 12-18 credits while abroad. There are additional costs such as airfare, visas, housing for some programs and the difference in currency conversion.

There is a mandatory information session which may be attended in either November or January. The application process takes place in February for the fall and spring semesters of the following academic year. The application consists of a portfolio, essay, and letter of recommendation, interview, and eligibility evaluation.

## STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS

Study Abroad Programs differ from exchange programs. Most study abroad programs are shorter in duration, ranging from six to eight weeks, although two programs are for the full semester. Study abroad programs are ideal for the student who wants to travel abroad and is more comfortable to be with a group of familiar people. Most programs are designed for specific majors and many are open to graduate students. Students receive credit for each program and each program has its own price to cover tuition, housing, and field trips. Examples of extra costs are airfare, insurance, meals, Study Abroad fee, and the difference in currency conversion.
