

## **Operational Action Plan 19/20**

Pratt Institute School of Information Last Updated: June 8, 2020

Recommended by the Faculty Council and Approved by the SI Dean on September 6, 2019.

## Overview

In December 2015, the Faculty Council adopted a <u>new set of goals for the School</u>, and in April 2017 a set of indicators and targets that could be used to measure the extent to which the goals were being met. The purpose of the Annual Assessment Report is to assess the extent to which the School's goals are being met and identify opportunities for improvement. This evaluative work informs the Operational Action Plan for the 2019/2020 academic year which aims to drive improvement to the programs and school through ensuring that schools goals are addressed.

## **Action Plan**

While all tasks are expected to be completed during the 19/20 academic year, priority flags are assigned such that should unforeseen events occur and plans are disrupted, tasks with "High" priority should take precedence over tasks with lower priority.
