## Frick Art Research Library Fellowship 2026-2027

### Fellowship information

Two fellowship opportunities are available at the Frick Art Research Library working with the web archiving team for the New York Art Resources Consortium (NYARC). Fellows will contribute to a unique web archive collection devoted to born-digital resources for art and art history, including websites for New York City galleries, museums, artists' websites, catalogues raisonnés, and auction catalogs. The fellows will evaluate candidate sites for web archiving; be trained in using Archive-It and Webrecorder tools to capture websites; perform review, maintenance and QA of archived websites; create bibliographic records for websites using OCLC Connexion; participate in discussions regarding web archiving policy and workflow for the Frick and NYARC; and potentially assist with beta testing of new tools and research. Fellows will be provided with introductions to the Acquisitions, Archives, Digital Art History, Digital/Conservation Labs, Metadata, Photoarchive, and Public Services teams of the Frick Art Research Library, and they will additionally have the opportunity to contribute to NYARC blog posts and become actively involved with the international web archiving community.

The fellowship recipient will work in a hybrid capacity for 8 hours/week (120 hours/semester for the fall 2026 and spring 2027 semesters; 30 weeks total from September 2026-May 2027), with remote web archiving QA work and meetings held both onsite and virtually. This fellowship includes a scholarship in the amount of \$8,200 that will be divided equally between the fall 2026 and spring 2027 semesters. Fellows must register for INFO 667 Art Librarianship and take either INFO 698 Practicum/Seminar or present their fellowship project at InfoShow2027 in spring 2027. If the fellowship recipient has previously taken INFO 667 Art Librarianship, this requirement can be substituted with another art librarianship/special collections/archives course subject to the approval of the Dean of the School of Information. The successful applicant must take at least 6 credits in both the fall 2026 and spring 2027 semesters.

Please note that continuing the fellowship through spring 2027 is contingent upon review of the fall 2026 semester by Frick Art Research Library staff.

The fellowship recipient will be selected by Frick Art Research Library staff following an initial review by Pratt SI staff. Official notification will be made in late April 2026.

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must have:

- started the MSLIS program no later than spring 2026
- a graduation date of June 1, 2027 or later
