- 1. **Raise Awareness** Increase awareness of faculty, staff and students with different physical, psychological and mental/cognitive abilities and ensure they have equal access to Pratt Institute.
- 2. **Remove Barriers** Physical, technological, procedural and policy improvements throughout campus to remove barriers that can prohibit faculty, staff and students with different abilities from being their best selves at Pratt.
- 3. **Appreciate Differences** Increase understanding of people with different abilities in our community through education on how they bring different perspectives to the table.
- 4. **Practice Inclusion** All students, faculty and staff are aware and accepting of all abilities, and actively work to create an environment that supports everyone's success.

Information Technology

- Enhanced tools for teaching and learning:
 - Developed the onePratt Student + Faculty Community Consoles with accessibility in mind using black text on a white background with easily discernible blue links
 - Launchpad remote lab console delivers all lab software via a browser without having the latest hardware and makes going to a campus lab optional
 - Production remote job submission community for 2D / 3D printing, milling, and cutting offers online consultation and knowledge bases, as well as options for home delivery of output
- All offerings are developed under Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG 2.0)
 using WAVE, an industry-standard web accessibility and evaluation tool
- Digital Wayfinding tool for iOS, Android and at map.pratt.edu highlighting accessibility routes based on your starting point with quick access to safety information, sculpture park, academic departments and more
- New digital PrattCard via the PrattSafe app and at idcard.pratt.edu allows you to generate your ID card as needed. Touchless readers being integrated for campus access and Covid clearance.
